Notebook III

This steno notebook, labeled Coeur d'Alene III, and listed as running "From 401-599", has, on the outside front cover, the list of the titles of seven texts. In effect, the notebook runs from page 401 to page 579. The back cover lists the titles of four other texts.

Steno notebooks are top-hinged, and when opened, are topbottom oriented: one page lies above the other. Reichard wrote the running text on the bottom page, reserving the top page for occasional notes. Like the other steno notebooks Reichard used. Notebook III has printed page numbers at the bottom left of each page, 1 through 100. As one reaches the last page of the notebook, page 100, one can turn the notebook over and continue writing. The back of page 100 has, in fact, the number 101 in its left bottom, and all the pages have numbers printed left bottom. The back of page 1 is numbered page 200. Reichard penciled in the appropriate cyphers to have the book begin at page 401, and continue through page 579. Before she reached page 500, Reichard occasionally wrote some annotations on the page that lay above the one being written on. When she turned the notebook to continue writing her running text, she found herself writing on pages that were not always blank. Several pages in fact contain notes and annotations that refer to the opposing page. The first such is the back of page 424, which also serves as page 577. This page has been inserted twice in this document, once as the back of page 424, and once as page 577. The same has been done with all other such double-duty pages. Here in table form is the outline of the contents of Notebook III. Material quoted verbatim is in *italics*.
